
The Global Food Crisis in Uganda





Uganda has one of the youngest and fastest growing populations in the world. **Poverty** affects close to half of all local children. The highest rates are in rural areas and girls are disproportionately affected.

Many Ugandans continue to deal with the aftermath of the brutal two-decade long civil war which terrorised the country's north until 2006 and created a severe humanitarian crisis.

## **Raiders in the night**

On the night Eli's family were robbed, he ran for his life. Raiders in Karamoja, Uganda are known to steal cattle and food before killing any males in the family to prevent retaliation. So when Eli heard his gate creak open, he rushed outside and threw himself behind a bush to hide.

When dawn broke, Eli crept back inside to see if anything could be salvaged. The raiders stole 57 chickens, his family's clothing, food and other household items. But the most significant loss was Eli's savings of \$158 from his business.

#### "The shop was growing and helping the family, but the enemy came and took everything. Now my business has collapsed," Eli says.

Raiders aren't the only reason Eli and his neighbours lose sleep. They worry about inflation and the rising cost of food. They worry about increasingly unpredictable weather. They worry about the lack of water and shrinking sorghum harvests.

Eli's 5-year-old daughter Alice is registered in Compassion's Child Sponsorship Program at their local church. Because of this support, their family was provided with 20 kilograms of flour and 13 kilograms of beans after the robbery.

While immediate food relief is essential at this point, the church is exploring long-term solutions to fight hunger—like irrigation—so people can farm all year round. **Through his struggle, Eli says he is grateful to the local church for making a difference for his family.-**
